Wyalusing Municipal Authority operates the public water supply and wastewater treatment. The Authority currently has limited excess capacity within both the water and sewer systems. Cargill also operates and maintains multiple groundwater wells for process water.

Existing access is off Taylor Avenue (State Route 706). Additional access is available on the west side of the property via Hollow Road.

Existing Terrain:

The property is currently occupied by an industrial facility that produces beef and pork products. The area is moderately hilly with slopes ranging from 8-25 percent, and includes existing buildings, rendering facility, paved parking areas, lawn/landscaping, and wooded areas. The east side of the site borders Wyalusing Creek and Brewer Creek runs through the center portion of the property. The area is primarily comprised of Rexford/Unadilla silt loams, Alton/Wyoming gravelly sandy loams and Pope soils.

Railroad Availability:

Currently there is no railroad access to this site.

Floodplain Regions:

The site is located within a 100-year floodplain region, Zone AE mainly affecting the western and eastern sides of the property.

The property has potential wetlands located on the east side of the site near Wyalusing Creek. Freshwater ponds are also on the property.






