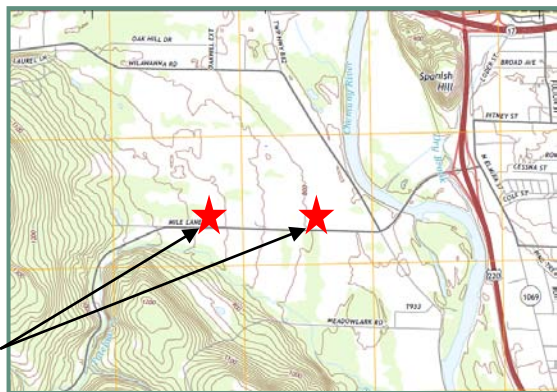

Site Resources

Infrastructure (Water & Sewer):

Athens Municipal Authority provides public sewer service and Aqua Pennsylvania provides public water. The Authority currently has excess sewer conveyance and collection capacity. Water and sewer are availability off from Road C/King Road.

Site Access:

Road C/King Road runs along the southern property boundary and the western site is just south of Road B, which leads to the interstate. Approximately one mile east of the site is State Route 220. This site provides easy access to Route 17/Interstate 86.

Existing Terrain:

The property includes flat open fields with light wood/forest coverage along the property boundaries. Slopes range from 0-8% and the majority of soils are Alton gravelly sandy loam, and Rexford silt loam.

Railroad Availability:

No, there is not railroad access to this site.

Floodplain Regions:

The site is not located within a 100-year floodplain region.

Wetlands (NWI Review):

Based on existing mapping, the property has potential wetlands located on the southwest corner of the property.

PNDI (Environmental Review):

There are no known impacts associated with the site.

Valley Energy owns and maintains a 6" low pressure gas line along Road C/King Road.

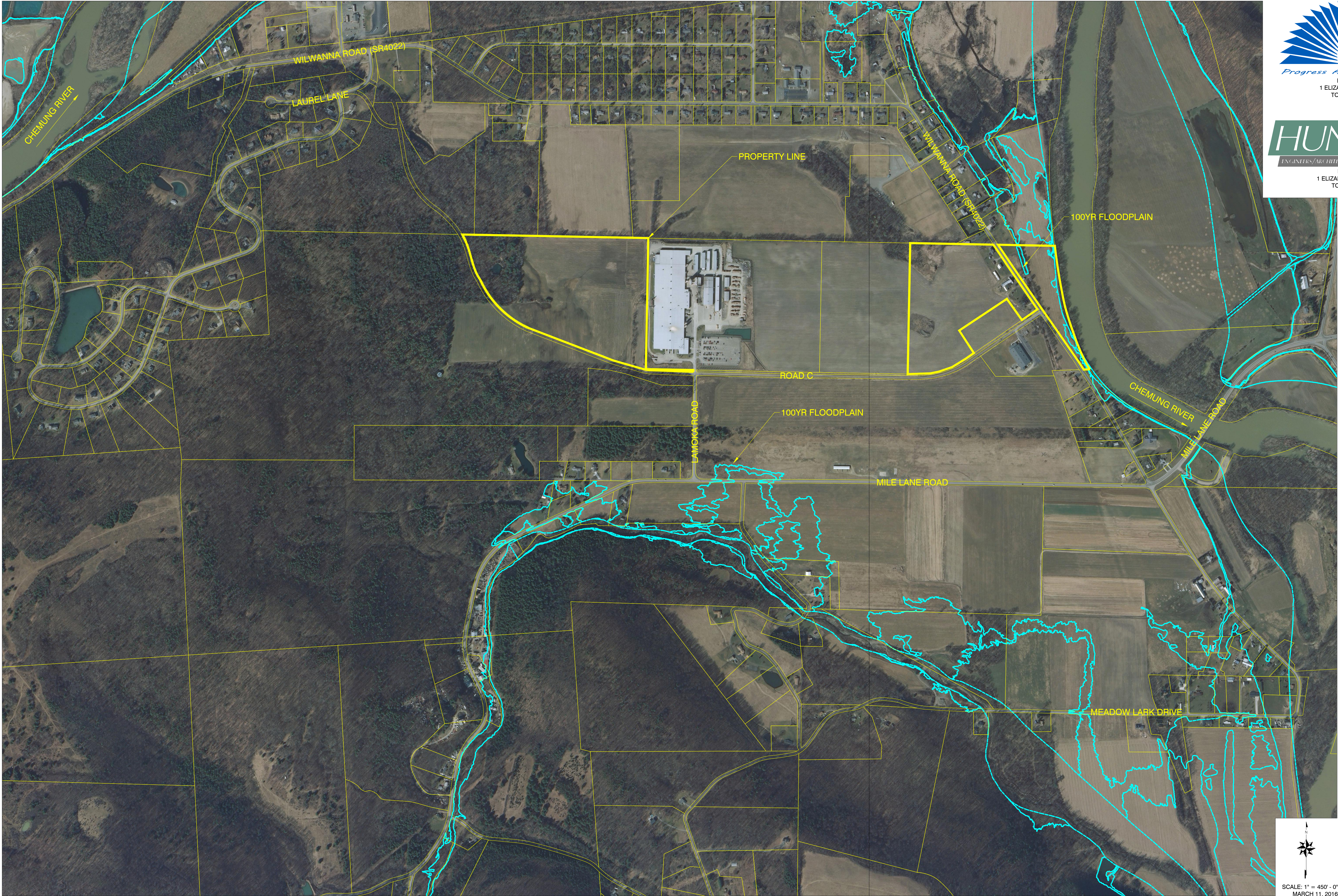
